Resurrection by Fr. Randy+

The lofty pine and paper birch forests surrounded me as I drove north from Bemidji towards Canada. The final stop in my northern journey was the southern shore of Red Lake—a massive body of water nestled against the shore of 840,000 acre Red Lake Nation. This enormous mass of pristine waters and land is the home to the Red Lake Band of Chippewa Indians, a resident population of nearly 9,000 members of seven clans. The People proudly live and work and learn and raise their families on this beautiful land.

The Red Lake Band of Chippewa Indians is known for their strong cultural traditions, including preservation of the Ojibwe language and traditional practices such as wild rice harvesting, fishing and hunting. "The pride of our culture, rooted in our feet."

Education of their children has been at the forefront of tribal efforts for many years, to provide a safe and healthy learning environment for all of their students. As we know, Red Lake suffered a horrible tragedy several years ago in a school shooting, which left several persons deceased and many physically and emotionally wounded. The wounds suffered by the people that day continue to be remembered and processed by their community—and by all of us. The Tribe, the Red Lake K-12 School District and the Red Lake Nation

College—all located on the shores of Red Lake—have been a long-time partners with the MN School Safety Center as we learn from each other and share best practices in all-hazards school safety.

This day, I was presenting a MN School Based Emergency Management Certificate to Don, the coordinator of safety and emergency management for the Red Lake School District. Don's family, school district and tribal officials were present to witness his receiving the award. Great congratulations were in order! Don is one of only 42 persons earning this distinction in the state—well done.

The Red Lake Nation people have long suffered throughout the history of this nation. This struggle with economic insecurity, substance abuse, stripping of identity, suicidality, could easily wash over a people and decimate them forever.

Yet, the Red Lake Nation remains strong, raising high the seven Ojibwe values; Humility, Truth, Courage, Honesty, Respect, Love, and Wisdom. They are providing instruction in the schools to bring back the speaking of Ojibwe language—in essence, resurrecting a core identity of their rich culture. The Red Lake Nation College recently opened a satellite campus in Minneapolis to serve tribal members living in the metro area. Don's oldest daughter spoke to me about her graduation from the college and her plans on studying law at Hamline University.

Great things are happening with the Red Lake Nation—and I consider it a resurrection of sorts. The People are wise, and they are strong. Seasons come and go. Difficult times, and good times. It is much like the scripture reading from Wisdom 3:1-5;

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time t dance; a time to throw stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing."

I pray our Creator and Mother of us all continues to hold up the beloved people of Red Lake, and abides with them as they live further into their resurrection.
